Service-Disabled Veteran Owned Business (SDVOB) in State Contracting

It is the policy of the Public Employment Relations Board and New York State to maximize opportunities for the participation of SDVOBs as contractors, subcontractors, and suppliers on its procurement contracts. Article 3 of the Veterans' Services Law allows eligible Veteran business owners to become certified as a New York State Service-Disabled Veteran-Owned Business (SDVOB). The goal of Article 3 is to encourage and support eligible SDVOBs to play a greater role in the state's economy by increasing their participation in New York State's contracting opportunities. The Article established a goal of 6% of procurement expenditures to be made to SDVOBs by State agencies. The OGS Division of Service-Disabled Veterans' Business Development is responsible for certifying eligible SDVOBs and assisting and promoting their participation in the state's procurement activities.
